Legal Framework

Constitution of India :-

Article 21 Right to Life and Personal Liberty⁵: - Article 21 of the Constitution guarantees the right to life and personal liberty. The judiciary has interpreted this right expansively, encompassing the right to live with dignity. While the right to life with dignity could be indirectly related to offenses like necrophilia, specific criminal provisions in the IPC would be the primary legal instruments to address such acts.⁶

Article 48 Directive Principles of State Policy (Organization of Agriculture and Animal Husbandry)²: - Article 48 encourages the state to organize agriculture and animal husbandry on modern and scientific lines. It specifically mentions the preservation and improvement of breeds and the prohibition of the slaughter of cows and calves and other milch and draught cattle. While this directive principle pertains more directly to animal husbandry, it underscores broader principles of compassion, preservation of life, and the recognition of the dignity of living beings.

Indian Penal Code: -

Section 297 - Trespassing on Burial Places: This section deals with offenses related to trespassing on burial places or the violation of sepulcher. It does not explicitly mention sexual offenses, but actions associated with necrophilia may be covered under the broader scope of desecration.

Section 377 - Unnatural Offenses: Section 377 criminalizes "carnal intercourse against the order of nature." While this provision was historically used to criminalize consensual homosexual acts, it was partially decriminalized by the Supreme Court of India in the Navtej Singh Johar v. Union of India case in 2018. However, the section remains applicable to non-consensual and unnatural acts, potentially including acts related to necrophilia.

Section 292 - Obscene Acts and Songs: This section deals with the distribution, sale, or public exhibition of obscene books, pamphlets, and other materials. Depending on the circumstances, acts associated with necrophilia could be deemed obscene under this section.

Section 201 - Causing Disappearance of Evidence: This section pertains to causing the disappearance of evidence of an offense, including the disposal of a corpse. Engaging in necrophilic acts might involve actions covered under this section.

Code Of Criminal Procedure: -

Registration of FIR (First Information Report): - When an offense, including necrophilia, comes to light, the CrPC governs the process of registering an FIR. The police initiate an investigation based on the information provided, and the subsequent procedures are guided by the CrPC.⁷

Arrest and Custody (Sections 41-60): - If there is sufficient evidence or reasonable suspicion, the police can arrest the accused. The CrPC delineates procedures for the arrest, detention, and interrogation of individuals suspected of criminal offenses, including those related to necrophilia.

Investigation (Chapter XII): - The CrPC provides guidelines for the investigation of criminal cases. In cases of necrophilia, investigators would follow procedures outlined in the CrPC to collect evidence, conduct interviews, and prepare a charge sheet.
